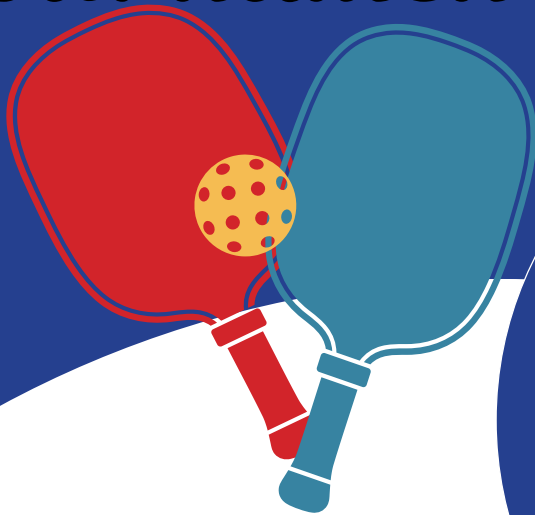


# Charity Pickleball Tournament & Potluck

## Round-Robin, Luck-of-the-Draw Charity Pickleball Tournament - 30 players - 6 courts

A draw will be made to divide 5 players per courts. Each player plays a rally round robin of 10 minutes against each of the other 4 players following this draw:

<b>Round 1</b>	<b>Round 2</b>	<b>Round 3</b>	<b>Round 4</b>	<b>Round 5</b>
1-2 vs 3-4	1-3 vs 2-5	1-5 vs 2-4	1-4 vs 3-5	2-3 vs 4-5
5 (Bye)	4 (Bye)	3 (Bye)	2 (Bye)	1 (Bye)

**Players will be ranked (1 to 30) by their total points made during their 4 games.**

The 24 best players will be divided in 3 pools: players ranked 1 to 8 in pool A, players ranked 9 to 16 in Pool B, and players ranked 17 to 24 in Pool C. They will continue to play a rally round robin of 15 points against another team following the above draw:

<b>Pool A (1<sup>st</sup> &amp; 2<sup>nd</sup> place)</b>	<b>Pool B (3<sup>rd</sup> &amp; 4<sup>th</sup> place)</b>	<b>Pool C (5<sup>th</sup> &amp; 6<sup>th</sup> place)</b>
Court # 1: 1-5 vs 3-7	Court # 3: 9-13 vs 11-15	Court # 5: 17-21 vs 19-23
Court # 2: 2-6 vs 4-8	Court # 4: 10-14 vs 12-16	Court # 6: 18-22 vs 20-24

In each pool, the winning team of each game will continue to play a rally round robin of 21 points against the other winning team following the above draw:

<b>Pool A (1<sup>st</sup> &amp; 2<sup>nd</sup> place)</b>	<b>Pool B (3<sup>rd</sup> &amp; 4<sup>th</sup> place)</b>	<b>Pool C (5<sup>th</sup> &amp; 6<sup>th</sup> place)</b>
Court #1: Winner of court 1 vs Winner of court 2	Court #2: Winner of court 3 vs Winner of court 4	Court #3: Winner of court 5 vs Winner of court 6

- The winning team of Pool A will have the gold medal and the losing team, the silver medal.
- The winning team of Pool B will have the bronze medal and the losing team, the 4<sup>th</sup> place.
- The winning team of Pool C will have the 5<sup>th</sup> place and the losing team, the 6<sup>th</sup> place.
